## Justification:

On August 14, 2007, the City received bids for the environmental clean up (lead) of the Saginaw Police Department's Small Arms Range. Lead is a hazardous material and a known health risk. Lead is managed under OSHA standards *Sec. 1910.1025 Lead.* It can easily contaminate the facility in which it's housed, namely the Saginaw Police Department. As protection for the employees who use the facility, this has to be cleaned to reduce any health hazard.

Justification:

On June 19, 2007, the City of Saginaw received a price quote from SolarBee for

a solar-powered 10,000 gal/minute lake circulator in the amount of \$47,990.00, which is

an increase of 4.3% over the price paid by the City in June of 2006 for an identical unit.

SolarBee also provided a letter certifying that they are a sole source for this technology

and no competitive products exist, to their knowledge.

The Water Treatment Division wishes to purchase a SolarBee solar powered

reservoir circulator to improve cost efficiency and raw water quality in our Lake Linton

storage reservoir located adjacent to the Water Treatment Plant facilities. The unit

reduces blue-green algae blooms, which cause taste and odor problems, by circulating

and oxygenating the reservoir water. The unit also has manifolds for improved copper

sulfate addition to the reservoirs. Copper sulfate is a chemical added to control algae.

More chemicals are required during taste and odor episodes. Water Treatment Plant staff currently add copper sulfate regularly using a boat in an attempt to control taste and odor causing blue-green algae. This is an expensive and labor-intensive process. The re-circulation unit will either greatly reduce these costs or eliminate them entirely and result in an overall improvement in raw water quality in the reservoir.

There is a satisfaction guarantee in which 70% of the original purchase price would be refunded if the City is not satisfied with the product one year after purchase. The unit has a 20 year expected service life. Last year, the City purchased two SolarBee units for the Kochville Raw Water reservoirs.

Ms Webster's employment was terminated in August, 2004. She has made a number of claims regarding the propriety of that discharge. While many of the claims have been dismissed, some remain for a trial now scheduled for October, 2007. The dismissed claims may also be the subject of appeals. The Self-Insurance Retention ("SIR") for this insured claim is \$150,000, of which slightly over \$105,000 has already been spent. The total exposure of the City for the remainder of the litigation is approximately \$45,000. It is likely that this would be exhausted even if the City were to entirely prevail at trial and on appeal.

The insurance carrier has expressed its desire to resolve this matter for the amount of \$170,000, the bulk of which it will be responsible for paying. In order to avoid the expense and uncertainties of litigation and resolve this matter, the City has negotiated this payment. The claimant has provided a full and complete release of liability.
