Recommended Actions:

1. Recommending approval of the Agreement with Saginaw County Community Action Committee, Inc. (CAC) for housing and credit counseling services for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2. HUD regulations require that all approved homebuyers take eight (8) hours of housing counseling. CAC's hourly rate is \$75.00. The total amount of a homebuyer's counseling session is \$600.00. Further recommend that the Director of Development and/or his designee be authorized to sign the agreement. Funds are budgeted in the Neighborhood Stabilization Program Professional Services Account, No. 279 6551 761 8001.
2. Recommending that the professional services contracted signed June 19, 2008, with Plante & Moran be extended for a period of six months for a cost of \$117,500.00, which is 50% of the current annual fee, and that the City Manager or his designee be authorized to execute this and any related document. Funds are available in the Fiscal Services – Controller's Division Professional Services Account, No. 101 1741 711 8001.
3. Recommending approval of the Urban Cooperation Agreement with Taymouth Township and the First Amendment to that Agreement. This agreement is a revenue sharing component of the Water Service Agreement between the two communities, to be executed on the same date. The Water Service Agreement requires the Taymouth Township to make payments to the City resulting from new residential, commercial, industrial and manufacturing developments within the township. The Taymouth Township Board of Trustees has approved the Urban Cooperation Agreement.
4. Recommending approval of a water service agreement between the City of Saginaw and Taymouth Township for the provision of treated water. The City of Saginaw has water treatment and transmission facilities, which it uses to supply potable water services to various wholesale customers, including Taymouth Township. Taymouth Township requires a secure source of water service into the future to assist development in its municipality. The Taymouth Township Board of Trustees has approved the Agreement.
5. Recommending approval of the Wholesale Water Agreement between the Saginaw Midland Water Supply Corporation and the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe of Michigan.

Subject: Diversion Gate

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend that the sole bid from Hamlett Engineering Sales Company (HESCO) be accepted and a purchase order be issued to them in the amount of \$17,801.00 for a replacement diversion gate for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

This vendor meets all requirements of §14.23, "Vendors", Purchasing, Contracting, and Selling Procedure," of Chapter 14, "Finance and Purchasing", of Title 1, "General Provisions" of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances O-1

Funds for this purchase are budgeted in the Sewer Operations and Maintenance Fund -Treatment and Pumping Division's Repairs and Replacements Account, No. 590-4830-861.97-20.

Justification:

On March 8, 2011, sealed bids were opened for a replacement diversion gate for the Wastewater Treatment Plant's influent channel. There are three diversion gates that direct the influent flow through the four influent channels. These gates are part of the original 1950 construction. In 2009 one of these gates failed and had to be replaced. At that time it was discovered that the remaining two gates would also require replacement. Funds were budgeted to replace one gate this year and the final gate replacement will be budgeted for next year. Hamlett Engineering Sales Company of Warren, MI, the manufacturer's representative for Rodney Hunt, the original manufacturer, submitted the sole bid of \$17,801.00.

Subject: Taymouth Township Urban Cooperation Agreement and First Amendment

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend approval of the Urban Cooperation Agreement with Taymouth Township ("Township") and the First Amendment to that Agreement. This Agreement is a revenue sharing component of the Water Service Agreement between the two communities, to be executed on the same date. These Agreements have been approved by the City Manager as to substance and the City Attorney as to form.

Justification:

The Water Service Agreement requires the Township to make payments to the City resulting from new residential, commercial, industrial and manufacturing developments within the Township. These requirements are set forth in the Urban Cooperation Agreement, which will result in payments to the City of Saginaw \$2,000.00 per new connection for each residential unit (inclusive of a 3% cumulative annual increase) and from \$5,000.00 to \$40,000.00 for connections resulting from new non-residential developments. As is the case with the Water Agreement, the initial fifteen (15) year term of this Agreement automatically renews for an additional fifteen (15) years, unless either party notifies the other of its desire to terminate. The Taymouth Township Board of Trustees has approved the Urban Cooperation Agreement.

Subject: Approval of Water Service Agreement with Taymouth Township

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend Council approve a water service agreement between the City of Saginaw and the Township of Taymouth for the provision of treated water. The Agreement has been approved by the City Manager as to substance and the City Attorney as to form.

Justification:

The City of Saginaw has water treatment and transmission facilities, which it uses to supply potable water services to various wholesale customers, including the Township of Taymouth. The Township of Taymouth requires a secure source of water service into the future to assist development in its municipality. The City requires a customer commitment so that it can develop and construct the correct infrastructure to supply water. The City of Saginaw and the Township of Taymouth have negotiated a fifteen (15) year agreement to provide water services with a fifteen (15) year renewal unless either party elects to terminate. The Township of Taymouth has already approved the Agreement.

Subject: Extension of the Plante & Moran contract to provide the duties of the Controller's Office

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend that the professional services contract, signed June 19, 2008, with Plante & Moran (P&M) be extended for a period of six months in the amount of \$117,500, which is fifty percent of the current annual fee, and that the City Manager or his designee be authorized to execute this and any related documents. The contract has been approved by the City Manager as to substance and the City Attorney as to form.

This vendor meets all requirements of §14.23, "Vendors", of "Purchasing, Contracting, and Selling Procedure," of Chapter 14, "Finance and Purchasing, of "Title 1, "General Provisions" of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances O-1.

Funds are available in the General Fund – Fiscal Services – Controller Division Professional Services Account, No. 101-1741-711-80-01.

Justification:

The current contract with P&M to provide the duties of the Controller's Office ends on June 30, 2011. Since contracting with P&M, the City has been able to resolve numerous accounting issues including a major accounts receivable dispute. Additionally, the Department of Fiscal Services has been able to reconcile bank records in a timely manner, complete audits on time without additional fees, and submit a comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR) for the first time in several years.

COUNCIL COMMUNICATION

The end of the current agreement coincides with the end of the City's fiscal year. The fiscal year end procedures require a great deal of detailed work as well as coordinated efforts between the Controller's Office, purchasing, accounts payable, budget, and other City departments. Further, according to requirements established by the State of Michigan, the annual audit must be submitted within six months of the close of the fiscal year. So that the City may close the fiscal year as efficiently as possible and meet state requirements for audit submission, it is requested that the contract be extended to December 31, 2011.

Prior to the expiration of this extension, the city will request proposals for providing Controller's Office services from several firms to obtain comprehensive services at a competitive fee. Additionally, the city management team will speak with union personnel to receive their recommendations and proposals if applicable.

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend approval of the Agreement with Saginaw County Community Action Committee Inc. ("CAC") for housing and credit counseling services for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 ("NSP2"). HUD regulations require that all approved homebuyers take eight hours of housing counseling. CAC's hourly rate is \$75.00. The total amount of a homebuyer's counseling session is \$600.00.

The Agreement has been approved as to substance by the City Manager and the City Attorney as to form. It is further recommended that the Director of Development and/or his designee be authorized to sign the Agreement.

This vendor meets all requirements of §14.23, "Vendors," of "Purchasing, Contracting, and Selling Procedure," of Chapter 14, "Finance and Purchasing," of Title 1, "General Provisions" of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances O-1.

Funds are budgeted in the Neighborhood Stabilization Program Professional Services Account, No. 279-6551-761-8001

Justification:

Requests for Qualifications ("RFQ") were issued to obtain housing and credit counseling services for the NSP 2 program. HUD regulations require that all approved homebuyers take eight hours of housing counseling. Currently, the NSP2 Program employs an individual that provides housing and credit counseling. However, staff determined that a vendor should be hired to serve as a backup, on an as-needed basis.

COUNCIL COMMUNICATION

The RFQ included a scoring section. The scoring criteria contained several factors including, but not limited to, capacity to perform counseling within a certain number of days, years of experience and certifications. After a thorough review of the responses and final tabulation of the scores, staff determined that the Agreement should be awarded to CAC. Prospective homebuyers that require long term credit counseling will be referred to CAC. However, the City is not responsible for paying CAC credit counseling fees for those individuals.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING UNIFORM TRANSFER PROVISION

WHEREAS, the City of Saginaw is a participating municipality in the Municipal Employees' Retirement System of Michigan ("MERS"); and

WHEREAS, the Standard MERS Transfer Rules became effective in August 2007; and

WHEREAS, under the Standard Rules, all transferees to a new division are covered under the active employee plan in the new division; where the defined benefit plan in the new division is closed to entrants, the accrued defined benefit (based on benefits, service and wages as of transfer date) of transferees is frozen as of transfer date; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Retirement Board action on November 10, 2010, the employing municipality will be allowed, on a one-time irrevocable and uniform basis, to adopt for all of its MERS divisions (present and future) an alternate policy which allows all transferred employees an individual choice at the time of transfer to either be placed in: (1) the division's open plan, **or** (2) the closed plan if it is the same plan type, provided there are active employees remaining in the plan type; and

WHEREAS, this alternate transfer provision applies to transferred employees only; rehired employees will continue to be enrolled into the active plan; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that effective March 21, 2011, the City Council of the City of Saginaw adopts this Resolution for all present and future employee divisions requiring that all transferred employees shall be given the individual choice to either be placed in the open plan or the closed division if it is the same plan type (in the division from which the employee is transferred) provided there are active employees remaining in the closed plan type.

Justification:

The City Engineer is in the process of reviewing fees charged for certain services provided by the Engineering Division. The fees established for installation have not been increased since 2001.

Currently the fee for a sewer extension is \$20.00. This fee no longer covers the cost of such inspections. Given the foregoing, it is recommended that the City increase its fee to forty-five dollars (\$45.00) to cover its cost.

Remove the wording 'or Utility Manager for Field operations' from §51.02 Installation Paragraph D, and §51.03 Paragraph A, B; also replace Chief Inspector in §51.03, Paragraph C with City Engineer.

The City of Saginaw Ordains:

Section 1. Paragraph (D) of §51.02, "Installations", and Paragraph B, C of §51.03, "Privately Constructed Sewers", Chapter 51, "Sewers", of Title V, "Public Works" of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§51.02 INSTALLATIONS

(D) No person shall install a sewer extension without first obtaining a written permit from the city Engineer. The fee for such permit shall be forty-five dollars (\$45.00).

§51.03 PRIVATELY CONSTRUCTED SEWERS

(B) No person shall install any sewer connection to any private sewer main which will be served directly or indirectly by the City sewerage system without first obtaining a written permit from the City Engineer. The fee for such permit shall be forty-five dollars (\$45.00).

(C) No person shall install any sewer extension from a connection of any private sewer main which will be served directly or indirectly by the City sewerage system without first obtaining a written permit from the City Engineer. The fee for such permit shall be forty-five dollars (\$45.00).

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect on April 28, 2011.

Subject: Sidewalk Construction and Repair Ordinance Amendment

Manager's Recommendation:

It is recommended that Paragraph (A) of § 96.01, "Sidewalk Construction and Repair," of Chapter 96, "Streets and Sidewalks", of Title IX, "General Regulations" of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, be amended.

Justification:

The City's ordinance for "Sidewalk Construction and Repair" in the public right-of-way requires a person to obtain a written permit from the City Engineer, which must be displayed on the construction site. Upon the completion of construction, the City Engineer, or his designee, must inspect the work to confirm it meets the established sidewalk specifications. The ordinance presently states, "The City Manager is hereby empowered, subject to the approval of the Council, to establish a fee for such permit." Currently the City has not charged for these permits, however, the City Engineer requests a fee of \$20.00 be established to assist in defraying the cost of this inspection. As in other City ordinances, it is best practice that the fee established be inserted in the ordinance to better notify the general public. As such, I recommend the language in the ordinance be changed to establish a fee of \$20 for this permit.

The City of Saginaw Ordains:

Section 1. Paragraph (A) of § 96.01, "Sidewalk Construction and Repair," of Chapter 96, "Streets and Sidewalks", of Title IX, "General Regulations" of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 96.01 SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR

(A) No person shall construct or repair any sidewalk in the public right-of-way except in accordance with the line, grade, slope, and specifications established by the City Engineer, nor without first obtaining a written permit from the City Engineer. Said written permit shall be prominently displayed on the construction site. Said person shall at all times comply with the requirements of § 96.04(C). The fee for such permit shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect on April 28, 2011.

Manager's Recommendation:

It is recommended that Paragraph (D) of §52.11, "Installations", and Paragraph (A), (B) & (C) of §52.12, "Privately Constructed Water Distribution Systems," of Chapter 52, "Water", of Title V, "Public Works" of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, be amended. Paragraph (E) has been added to the ordinance §52.11.

Justification:

The City Engineer is in the process of reviewing fees charged for certain services provided by the Engineering Division. The fees established for Water Extensions have not been increased since 2001.

Currently the fee for water extensions is \$20.00. This fee no longer covers the cost of such inspections. Given the foregoing, it is recommended that the City increase its fee to forty-five dollars (\$45.00) to cover its cost.

Adding a new permit for inspection of any work done at the water meter only, the fee for such permit shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00).

The City of Saginaw Ordains:

Section 1. Paragraph (D) of §52.11, "Installations", and Paragraphs (A), (B) & (C) of §52.12, Chapter 52, "Water", of Title V, "Public Works" of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 52.11 INSTALLATIONS

- (D) No person shall install a water extension without first obtaining a written permit from the City Engineer. The fee for such permit shall be forty-five dollars \$45.00.
- (E) No person shall work at the water meter without first obtaining a written permit from the City Engineer. The fee for such permit shall be forty-five dollars \$20.00.

§ 52.12 PRIVATELY CONSTRUCTED WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

- (A) No person shall construct any private water main which will be served directly or indirectly by the City water distribution system without first obtaining a written permit from the City Engineer. The application amount for each bridge will vary and will be based on the needs of each individual bridge. If approved, funds for the City's share will be made available in FY 2014/2015 Major Streets Fund – Bridge Projects Division's Construction Projects Account No. 202-4616-781-8047. The City of Saginaw will be responsible for design and construction engineering costs.

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) requires as part of the application process, that a resolution be adopted by City Council indicating that the application has been reviewed and that the City is actively seeking these funds for the projects as stated above. This resolution appears under the regular order of business.

Justification:

Per the MDOT Local Bridge Program Guidelines, the total number of applications from any local agency is limited to five (5). The preventative maintenance, structure rehabilitation and replacement, and approach costs may be eligible for a maximum of 95 percent participation from federal and/or state funds. The right-of-way, design engineering and construction engineering costs are not eligible for Local Bridge Program funds. Per the

City of Saginaw's most recent bi-annual bridge inspection reports, it is apparent that all of the City of Saginaw's six (6) vehicular bridges are in need of preventative maintenance and some need scour corrective action. The Norman Street Bridge over Veterans Memorial Parkway was constructed in 1971 and has deteriorated to a point where it now needs rehabilitation or reconstruction. The remainder of the bridges are in need of preventative maintenance to avoid needing premature reconstruction. The Local Bridge Program was enacted in 2004 and is the federal legislation that provides funds for bridges. The MDOT has called for project applications from eligible communities who wish to participate in this program. The applications have to meet certain criteria and because of fund limitations, the applications are evaluated by MDOT and ranked against these criteria. As projects of this magnitude require substantial lead time to start of work, it is recommended that staff be directed to submit an application for funding no later than May 1, 2011 in order to qualify for consideration in the State's fiscal year 2014 funding program.

If the public safety requires immediate action, the Director of Public Services may suspend the operation of this provision.

(5) Whenever the Council shall determine that the paving or resurfacing of any street or alley, or part thereof, is necessary, the Director of Public Services shall, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to commencement of construction, serve notice upon all public utilities requiring time to install all necessary underground work.

(6) The City Manager is hereby empowered, subject to approval by the Council, to make such additional rules and regulations pertaining to the making of excavations or openings in any street, alley, or public places as are necessary to protect property or the safety or welfare of the public, and no person shall fail to comply with any such rules or regulations.
