Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend that City Council approve the amendment to the Subrecipient Agreement for FY 2016-17 between the City of Saginaw and Habitat for Humanity. The Amendment is approved by the City Manager as to substance and the City Attorney as to form. Further, it is recommended that the Mayor or his designee be authorized to sign the contracts.

Justification:

An Amendment to the original Agreement with Habitat for Humanity has been prepared to include the specific addresses and estimated funds that will be used for each project. HUD requires contracts to list specific addresses of the properties that will be rehabilitated. On July 25, 2016 Council approved the HOME agreement with Habitat without addresses because at the time they were not known. Habitat will rehab houses at 2011 Holcomb and 1237 South Warren. The property on South Warren will cost approximately \$29,000.00. 2011 Holcomb will be purchased for \$12,000 and the rehab is estimated to be \$43,000, for a total of \$55,000 being committed to that address. The total amount of construction for both projects is \$84,000.00. The Agreement for FY 2016-2017 is in the amount of \$65,079 and will be combined with the remaining funds from the prior year to complete both projects.

Homes will be sold to low to moderate income buyers. Habitat must complete projects by June 30, 2019. The original Agreement outlines the HOME Program, which includes the purchase of materials for rehabilitation of property, and operation expenses.

Council approved the City's submission to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for these funds on March 14. 2016.

- (7) Such other reasonable requirements as said City Council deems appropriate.

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend that the sole bid, with post-bid addendum, from Control Solutions Inc., of Byron Center, MI, for the Energy Management and Security System Replacement Contract (C-1637) be accepted and a contract awarded to them in the amount of \$260,309.70. Contract documents have been signed by the contractor. The contract has been approved by me as to substance and is subject to the City Attorney's approval as to form.

Justification:

On February 7, 2017, the City received one (1) qualifying bid for the Energy Management and Security Systems Replacement Contract (C-1637) in the amount of \$340,703. A post-bid addendum was issued through negotiations with the contractor. The post-bid addendum modified some bid items and removed other bid items to keep the project within the \$261,736 available budget.

This contract includes energy management system upgrades for City Hall, the Public Works Building and the Police Buildings, upgrades to the surveillance system and demand controls for the rooftop ventilation system for the Public Works Building, and steam trap and thermostatic valve replacements for the City Hall heating, ventilation and cooling system.

This project is financed by the six million dollar General Obligation Capitol Improvement Bond that was approved by Council on August 24, 2015. The intent of this bond was to finance the costs for new vehicles, capital improvements to the City's street light system, and upgrades to energy management systems.

The existing energy management systems are outdated with obsolete components, and are a maintenance liability. The current systems provide a lack of diagnostics related to mechanical systems which increases maintenance time. The existing systems also allow for excessive energy use due to system limitations. The proposed energy management system upgrades would upgrade the outdated, dial up energy management systems in City Hall and the Public Works Building with a web-based software system, and expand the system to integrate the Police Buildings The upgrades will provide graphics for each building with point and click accessibility and provide occupancy sensor controls of several air handlers, chilled water reset, and other elements that will ultimately decrease maintenance time, energy use, and increase efficiency. The replacement of steam traps and thermostatic valves at City Hall will decrease energy usage. The upgrade to the demand controls for the Public Works Building rooftop ventilation system will provide a more uniform building temperature.

Subject: Application for Local Bridge Program Funds – ROW Division

Prepared by: Beth D. London, Public Services Department

Manager's Recommendation:

I recommend that the City of Saginaw actively seek FY 2020 Local Bridge Program Funds for preventative maintenance on the Center Street, Court Street, Genesee Avenue, Holland Avenue, Johnson Street and Norman Street Bridges. The application amount for each bridge varies and is based on the needs of each individual bridge.

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) requires as part of the Local Bridge Program Fund Application process, that a resolution be adopted by City Council indicating that the application has been reviewed and that the City is actively seeking these funds for the projects as stated above. This resolution appears under the regular order of business.

Justification:

The Local Bridge Program was enacted in 2004 and is the federal legislation that provides funds for local agency bridges. MDOT has called for project applications from eligible communities who wish to participate in this program. The applications have to meet certain criteria and because of funding limitations, the applications are evaluated by MDOT and ranked against these criteria.

Per the MDOT Local Bridge Program Guidelines, the total number of applications from any local agency is limited to five. The preventative maintenance projects are eligible for a maximum of 95 percent participation from federal and/or state funds. The City is responsible for the 5 percent match and all right-of-way, design engineering and construction engineering costs. Per the City of Saginaw's most recent bi-annual bridge inspection reports, it is apparent that all of the City of Saginaw's six vehicular bridges are in need of preventative maintenance.

Funds for the City's share of the construction costs will be made available in the FY 2020 and FY 2021 Major Streets Fund – Bridge Projects Division's, Construction Projects Account No. 202-4616-822.000, pending Council approval of the FY 2020 and FY 2021 budgets. Funds for design and construction engineering costs will be made available in the FY 2019, FY 2020 and FY 2021 Major Streets Fund – Bridge Projects Division's, Engineering Services Account No. 202-4616-802.000, pending Council approval of the FY 2019, FY 2020 and FY 2021 budgets.

WHEREAS: on or about April 7, 2017, Michigan Hospitality Management LLC., d.b.a. Bourbon & Co., submitted an application for Encroachment Permit; and

WHEREAS: on April 11, 2017, Michigan Hospitality Management LLC., d.b.a. Bourbon & Co., was issued a Class I Encroachment Permit from the City Zoning Division for 118 E. Genesee Avenue to include the installation of a semi-permanent fence in an area on the City's sidewalk at 118 E. Genesee Avenue; and

WHEREAS: pursuant to §96.45 through §96.59, Chapter 96, Title IX, of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances, "Encroachments," such Encroachment Permit is to be renewed annually, have routine inspections, require insurance naming the City as additional insured, and may be revoked at any time; and

WHEREAS: the Michigan Hospitality Management LLC., d.b.a. Bourbon & Co., has further requested that it be allowed to serve alcoholic beverages in this fenced area during the hours of operation; and

WHEREAS: the Michigan Hospitality Management LLC., d.b.a. Bourbon & Co., has applied for and is awaiting approval for an Add Bar Permit with the Michigan Liquor Control Commission; and

WHEREAS: the City Council can provide authorization for the service of alcoholic beverages on public property in accordance with §132.01 (C), Chapter 132, Title XII, of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS: §132.01 (c), Chapter 132, Title XIII of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances states that City Council can authorize the service of alcoholic beverages on public property if the vendor provides evidence of all of the following to the satisfaction of the City:

- (1) The precise location where said beverages are to be sold and consumed;
- (2) The date and times for said activities;
- (3) A proper state license for the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages at the place and times listed in the subsections (1) and (2) above;
- (4) Adequate public liability and property damage insurance for the benefit of the City with a company licensed to sell insurance by the state;
- (5) Such other insurance as the City Council deems adequate for the benefit of the City:
- (6) Adequate personnel to control the premises where the alcoholic beverages are to be sold and consumed; and

(7) Such other reasonable requirements as said City Council deems appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Saginaw hereby authorizes the service of alcoholic beverages on public property in a fenced area on the City's sidewalk at 118 E. Genesee Avenue, contingent upon the Michigan Hospitality Management LLC., d.b.a. Bourbon & Co., providing to the City mandatory documents and proofs listed in §132.01 (c), Chapter 132, Title XIII, of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances, and receives approval from the Michigan Liquor Control Commission for an Add Bar Permit.
