**THEREFORE**, I, Greg Branch, Mayor of the City of Saginaw, do hereby proclaim the week of October 6-12, 2013 as

Moved by Council Member Braddock, seconded by Council Member Kloc to reconvene at 7:07 p.m. 8 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. Motion approved.

Mayor Branch reported that City Charter, Sections 25 and 27 amendments were approved by the voters on November 3, 2009, that requires "a 2/3 majority vote of the elected, appointed and seated members of Council," which means 6 votes of Council, as verified by the City Clerk. **Manager’s Recommendation:**

I recommend approval of a City-Wide Cost Allocation Plan Agreement between the City of Saginaw (“City”) and Maximus, Inc. This agreement provides for the preparation of a cost allocation plan that will be utilized in fiscal years 2015, 2016, and 2017. The plans would be based on actual expenditures for the years ending June 30, 2013, June 30, 2014, and June 30, 2015. The total cost for the three year agreement will be \$41,250, payable upon completion of each annual plan at a rate of \$13,750 per year. The proposed fee represents a decrease from the previous year’s fee and remains the same for all three years of the contract.

The agreement has been approved by the City Manager as to substance and the City Attorney as to form.

**Justification:**

A Cost Allocation Plan (CAP) is an allocation of indirect costs to programs, activities, and/or cost objectives; the CAP promotes fair and equitable sharing of indirect costs, allows a local unit to recognize the “full” cost of service, allows for better management of resources, and allocates certain general fund costs to other funds. Essentially, the CAP allows the City to charge other funds for general fund services such as accounting, payroll, purchasing, human resources, general management, etc. These expenses are charged to other funds, such as water and sewer, and the result is revenue returned to the general fund. The City has contracted with Maximus to prepare the CAP since 2008; Maximus is one of the leaders in CAP preparation in Michigan and throughout the region.

This vendor meets all requirements of §14.23, "Vendors", of "Purchasing, Contracting, and Selling Procedure," of Chapter 14, "Finance and Purchasing", of Title 1, "General Provisions" of the Saginaw Code of Ordinances O-1.

Funds are budgeted and available in the General Fund–Department of Fiscal Services – Administration Division, Professional Services Account No. 101-1740-801.000 for this purchase.

**Manager’s Recommendation:**

I am recommending that the City Council authorize the Director of Employee Services to issue a request for proposal to Executive Search firms for the purpose of recruiting a City Manager for a fee not to exceed \$25,000.

**Justification:**

With the retirement of the City Manager, Darnell Earley, effective October 11, 2013, Employee Services will require the authorization from City Council to request proposals from several Executive Search firms that specialize in Public Sector City Manager/Administrator recruitment. Once proposals are received by the City, interviews will be scheduled with the Council as a “Committee of the Whole”. Based on the vendor proposals, presentations and interviews, Council will then select one of the Executive Search firms to conduct the search for the City Manager vacancy.

The funds are available in the General Fund's Office of Employee Services Professional Services Account No 101-1725-801.000 (\$13,659), Sewer Operations and Maintenance Fund - Administration Division's Professional Services Account No. 590-4810-801.000 (\$5,103), and Water Operations and Maintenance Fund - Administration Division's Professional Services Account No. 591-4710-801.000 (\$6,238).

**Manager's Recommendation:**

It is recommended that the FY 2014 General Fund Revenue's Use of Fund Equity Account No. 101-0000-989.000 be increased from \$0 to \$5,000. This increase is due to the approval of donations by the City/School Liaison Advisory Committee to the First Ward Community Center during the Liaison Committee's July 18, 2013 meeting. This increase in revenues will be offset by an increase to the City/School Liaison Division's Professional Services Account No. 101-0105-801.000 by the same amount.

**Justification:**

On July 18, 2013, the City/School Liaison Advisory Committee approved a \$5,000 donation to First Ward Community Center. This donation is part of the on-going support from the City and School Board to assist First Ward Community Center with activities such as First Ward's Summer Basketball League. The FY 2014 Approved Budget does not include funds for this advisory committee; however, there is a fund balance from previous years. This budget adjustment establishes the committee's budget for Fiscal Year 2014 using the fund balance.

**Manager’s Recommendation:**

I recommend that a purchase order be approved and issued to SQS, INC. d/b/a ERG Environmental Services of Livonia, MI, the low bidder, in the amount of \$4,228 for a period of two years (\$2,114 /year) for the annual clean-up of the small arms range.

**Justification:**

On September 17, 2013, (2) qualified vendors submitted bids in response to the City of Saginaw’s request for Proposal #1160-13 for the environmental clean-up of lead in the Saginaw Police Department Small Arms Range. Lead is a hazardous material and a known health risk. Lead is managed under OSHA standards *Sec. 1910.1025 Lead*. For the protection of department employees, it is imperative that the gun range is cleaned professionally on an annual basis.

**Subject:** Troubled Asset Relief Program Hardest Hit Grant Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Saginaw and the Saginaw County Land Bank Authority

**Manager's Recommendation:**

I recommend approval of the Troubled Asset Relief Program Hardest Hit Grant ("TARP") Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between the City of Saginaw and the Saginaw County Land Bank Authority. The term of the MOU is for two (2) years. The MOU is subject to my approval as to substance and the City Attorney as to form. Further, it is recommended that City Council authorize the City Manager and/or his designee be authorized to sign the MOU on behalf of the City. Moreover, it is recommended that the City Manager and/or his designee be authorized to execute any other documents related to the administration of the grant.

**Justification:**

The City of Saginaw ("City") and the Saginaw County Land Bank Authority ("SCLBA") secured TARP funds provided by the Michigan State Housing Development Authority ("MSHDA") for blight elimination. Specifically, the City and SCLBA secured funds in the amount of \$11,196,194. The parties, acting in partnership, will demolish up to 950 blighted residential properties in various neighborhoods throughout the City.

The parties were advised by MSHDA that there must be an MOU, which sets forth the responsibilities of the City and the SCLBA. Pursuant to the terms of the MOU, the SCLBA is responsible for the acquisition, ownership and maintenance of properties. In addition, it is responsible for paying all taxes and costs associated with title and realtor expenses. Furthermore, the proceeds from the sale of SCLBA vacant and side lots will be retained by it. Per the MOU, the parties will utilize the services of the demolition contractor procured by the City. In addition, the City's procured demolition services are considered a pass through expense that will be paid by the SCLBA.

Each property acquired with TARP funds will receive a \$750 maintenance stipend. The SCLBA will place the stipend into a separate account. A committee consisting of the SCLBA Chairperson and Land Bank Manager and the City's Chief Inspector and Block Grant Administrator will maintain the account. In



addition, pursuant to the terms of the MOU, the Chief Inspector is designated as the City's liaison and the Land Bank Manager is the liaison for the SCLBA.

Furthermore, funds in the amount of \$500 or 10% of project related costs can be utilized for administrative costs. The SCLBA and the City will each receive 50% percent of these funds to offset administrative costs. Approval of the MOU will establish the relationship between the parties for the execution of these funds.

**Manager's Recommendation:**

**Justification:**

On September 10, 2013, bids were received for two replacement Trane rooftop HVAC units for the Maintenance and Service Division. In January and February of this year, the Maintenance and Service Division experienced failures on two of the four 20 year old units that serve the front office portion of the main building. These units were replaced on an emergency basis in February 2013. At the same time, Spicer Engineering was given the task of determining where the roof on the main building was leaking. This required an evaluation of the rooftop HVAC units by a local heating and air conditioning contractor, A.C .Klopf. It was during their evaluation that the second HVAC unit was discovered to have a broken heat exchanger. Ultimately, Spicer concluded in their study that the remaining two units have also deteriorated to the point of needing replacement as well and the curbing they rested on was the source of the leakage.

**Manager's Recommendation:**

I recommend approval to add §92.21, "Outdoor and Open Burning," to Chapter 92, "Fire Protection and Public Safety," of Title IX, "General Regulations," of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1.

**Justification:**

Requests have been presented by citizens, council members and fire department personnel, asking for an ordinance that allows the use of patio style wood burners and devices, such as chimneas, and for other regulated outdoor and open burning within the City. Existing ordinances prohibits open fires within the City, while allowing open wood burning barbeques and pit or wood-burner fires, as long as food is being cooked over the fire.

An Ordinance has been prepared that allows reasonable outdoor and open burning with regulations, provides for inspection by City fire personnel prior to use, issuance of a permit following inspection approval and payment of the required fee. This ordinance is compatible with ordinances §50.10, "On-Site Burning," and §92.20, "International Fire Code," "Adopted; Fire Code Amendments," upon the adoption of each applicable amendment.

This ordinance is modeled after the 2006 model ordinance for Outdoor and Open Burning, "A Guide for Michigan Counties, Cities, Villages and Townships," promulgated by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. This model is successfully used throughout many municipalities.

In addition to legal counsel and City administration, this ordinance has been reviewed by representatives of the City Fire Department and Fire Union. I have reviewed it for content and the City Attorney for substance. It appears under the regular order of business.

A NEW ORDINANCE TO ADD § 92.21, "OUTDOOR AND OPEN BURNING," TO CHAPTER 92, "FIRE PROTECTION AND PUBLIC SAFETY," OF TITLE IX, "GENERAL REGULATIONS," OF THE CITY OF SAGINAW CODE OF ORDINANCES, O-1.

The City of Saginaw ordains:

Section 1. § 92.21, "Outdoor and Open Burning," is hereby added to Chapter 92, "Fire Protection and Public Safety," of Title IX, "General Regulations," of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, and shall read as follows:

### **§92.21 OUTDOOR AND OPEN BURNING**

**(A) Purpose.** This ordinance is intended to promote the public health, safety and welfare and to safeguard the health, comfort, living conditions, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Saginaw by regulating the air pollution and fire hazards of open burning and outdoor burning.

**(B) Title.** This ordinance shall be known as the "City of Saginaw Outdoor and Open Burning Ordinance."

**(C) Applicability.** This ordinance applies to all outdoor burning and open burning within the City of Saginaw.

1. This ordinance does not apply to grilling or cooking food using charcoal, wood, propane or natural gas in cooking or grilling appliances.
2. This ordinance does not apply to burning for the purpose of generating heat in a stove, furnace, fireplace or other heating device within a building used for human or animal habitation.
3. This ordinance does not apply to the use of propane, acetylene, natural gas, gasoline or kerosene in a device intended for heating, construction or maintenance activities.

**(D) Severability.** Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected.

**(E) Definitions.**

1. "Clean wood" means natural wood which has not been painted, varnished or coated with a similar material; has not been pressure

treated with preservatives; and does not contain resins or glues as in plywood or other composite wood products.

2. "Construction and demolition waste" means building waste materials, including but not limited to waste shingles, insulation, lumber, treated wood, painted wood, wiring, plastics, packaging, and rubble that results from construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition operations on a house, commercial or industrial building, or other structure.
3. "Fire Chief" means the Chief of the City of Saginaw Fire Department or other person designated by the City Manager.
4. "Municipality" means a county, township, city, or village.
5. "Nuisance" means a foul or obnoxious odor, the emission of smoke that obstructs vehicle or pedestrian traffic on a nearby public road, sidewalk, or walkway; the emission of smoke that interferes unreasonably with the peaceful enjoyment of the adjacent properties, or any other by-product of outdoor or open burning that creates a nuisance as defined by §94.01 by the Saginaw Code of Ordinances.
6. "Outdoor burning" means open burning or burning in an outdoor wood-fired boiler, patio wood burning unit or approved fire pit.
7. "Open burning" means kindling or maintaining a fire where the products of combustion are emitted directly into the ambient air without passing through a stack or a chimney. This includes burning in a burn barrel.
8. "Outdoor wood-fired boiler" means a wood-fired boiler, stove or furnace that is not located within a building intended for habitation by humans or domestic animals.
9. "Patio wood-burning unit" means a chimnea, patio warmer, fire pit, or other portable wood-burning device used for outdoor recreation and/or heating.
10. "Refuse" means any waste material except trees, logs, brush, stumps, leaves, grass clippings, and other vegetative matter.
11. "Fire pit" means a brick, masonry, cement or stone constructed fireplace or metal fire ring for open burning the upper surface of which is not more than eighteen (18) inches above the surrounding grade, with an inside bottom surface that is not more than six (6) inches below the surrounding grade, and with an inside dimension where combustion

can take place that is not more than nine (9) square feet of area at either the top or bottom.

**(F) General prohibition on outdoor burning and open burning.** Open burning and outdoor burning are prohibited in the City of Saginaw unless the burning is specifically permitted by this ordinance.

**(G) Agricultural burning.** Open burning of weeds, brush, and crop stubble on agricultural lands is allowed if conducted in accordance with other applicable provisions of this ordinance.

**(H) Prescribed burning.**

1. "Prescribed Burn" means the burning, in compliance with a prescription and to meet planned fire or land management objectives, of a continuous cover of fuels. A "prescription" means a written plan establishing the criteria necessary for starting, controlling, and extinguishing a burn.
2. Fires set for forest, prairie, and wildlife habitat management are allowed only if conducted in accordance with Part 515 of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, MCL 324.51501 et seq.
3. The owner of the property where the prescribed burn is to occur shall first obtain a permit as required in Section (L) of this ordinance.

**(I) Outdoor wood-fired boilers.** An outdoor wood-fired boiler may be installed and used in the City of Saginaw only in accordance with all of the following provisions:

1. The outdoor wood-fired boiler shall be installed and used only in an area zoned for R-1A use and consistent with other zoning requirements.
2. The outdoor wood-fired boiler shall not be used to burn refuse.
3. The outdoor wood-fired boiler shall be located at least 100 feet from the nearest building which is not on the same property as the outdoor wood-fired boiler and at least 25 feet from the nearest building which is on the same property.
4. The outdoor wood-fired boiler shall have a chimney that extends at least 10 feet above the ground surface. If there are any residences within 300 feet of the outdoor wood-fired boiler, the chimney shall also extend at least as high above the ground surface as the height of the roof of the tallest of such residences. The Fire Chief may

approve a lesser height on a case-by-case basis if necessary to comply with the boiler's manufacturer recommendations and if the smoke from the lower chimney height does not create a nuisance for adjacent neighbors.

5. The owner of the outdoor wood-fired boiler shall obtain an annual permit from the Fire Chief in accordance with Section (L) of this ordinance.

**(J) Patio wood-burning units.** A patio wood-burning unit may be installed and used in the City of Saginaw only in accordance with all of the following provisions:

1. The patio wood-burning unit shall not be used to burn refuse.
2. The patio wood-burning unit shall burn only clean wood.
3. The patio wood-burning unit shall be located at least 25 feet from the nearest structure which is not on the same property as the patio wood-burning unit.
4. The patio wood-burning unit shall not cause a nuisance to neighbors.
5. The owner of the property where the patio wood-burning unit is used has obtained a permit as required in Section (L) of this ordinance.
6. A fire contained in an approved patio wood burning unit shall be constantly attended and supervised by a competent person of at least eighteen (18) years of age until the fire is extinguished and is cold. The person shall have readily available for use such fire extinguishing equipment as may be necessary for the total control of the fire.

**(K) Fire suppression training.** Notwithstanding sections (F) and (G) of this ordinance, structures and other materials may be burned for fire suppression training only in accordance with appropriate fire department policies and procedures.

**(L) Burning Permits.**

1. No person shall start or maintain any outdoor burning or open burning covered under this section without a permit issued by the Fire Chief.
2. No person shall use a patio wood-burning unit without first having obtained a one-time patio wood-burning unit permit issued by the Fire

Chief. The fee for each one-time burning permit shall be \$50.00 and the permit shall only allow use of the unit for which it is issued and shall apply only to the use of that patio wood-burning unit on the property for which it was issued.

3. The owner or occupant of the property shall obtain an annual burning permit for each wood-fired boiler as appropriate and as required by section (I) 5 before using the outdoor wood-fired boiler. The fee for each annual burning permit shall be \$25.00. An annual permit expires on June 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.
4. When weather conditions warrant, the Fire Chief may temporarily suspend issuing burning permits and may temporarily suspend previously issued burning permits for open or outdoor burning.
5. A permit issued under this section shall require compliance with all applicable provisions of this ordinance and any additional special restrictions deemed necessary to protect public health and safety.
6. Any violation of the conditions of a permit shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance. Any violation of this ordinance or the permit shall void the permit.
7. Before conducting an outdoor burning or open burning or using a patio wood-burning unit, the property owner, or other person needing a permit, shall contact the fire chief for an inspection of the property and/or any outdoor burning appliance to obtain the required permit. A permit will not be issued until an inspection has been conducted by the fire Chief or their designee.

**(M) Liability.** A person utilizing or maintaining a fire as an outdoor or open burn shall be responsible for all fire suppression costs and any other liability resulting from damage caused by the fire.

**(N) Right of entry and inspection.**

1. The Fire Chief or any authorized person who presents credentials may inspect any property for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.
2. Any person applying for a permit for a patio wood-burning unit shall permit inspection by the Fire Chief or any authorized person of the unit and the location where it will be located for compliance with this Ordinance before using the unit.

**(O) Enforcement and penalties.**

1. The Fire Chief or any authorized officer, agent, employee or representative of the City of Saginaw is authorized to enforce the provisions of this ordinance.
2. Any person, firm, association, partnership, corporation, or governmental entity who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance or fails to comply with a duly authorized Order issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be deemed to be responsible for a municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan Statute and as provided by Chapter 37 of the City of Saginaw CODE OF ORDINANCES, which shall be punishable by civil fine determined in accordance with the following schedule:

3. The responsible party, upon determination of responsibility for a violation, shall also be assessed an additional penalty of \$5.00 for each day each violation is allowed to continue after written notice of the violation has been served on the violator by posting on the property or by first class mail return receipt requested.
4. The violator shall also be ordered to pay costs which may include all expenses, direct and indirect, which the City of Saginaw has incurred in connection with each municipal infraction. In no case, however, shall costs of less than \$50.00, nor more than \$500.00, be ordered for each violation. In addition, the City of Saginaw shall have the right to proceed in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of obtaining an injunction, restraining order, or other appropriate remedy to compel compliance with this Ordinance. Each day that a violation of this Ordinance exists shall constitute a separate violation of this Ordinance.

This ordinance shall become effective October 31, 2013.

**Manager's Recommendation:**

I recommend approval that subsection (A), "Open Burning," of § 50.10, "On-Site Burning," of Chapter 50, "Solid Waste," of Title V, "Public Works," of the City of Saginaw Code of Ordinances, O-1, be amended.

**Justification:**

Requests have been presented by citizens, council members and fire department personnel, asking the regulated use allowance of outdoor and open burning. An Ordinance has been prepared that specifically amends §50.10 (A) "Open Burning," to provide for open burning of refuse in an R-1A zone if all conditions are met as specified in ordinance §92.21 "Outdoor and Open Burning." This ordinance amendment will provide compatibility between ordinance §92.20, "International Fire Code," "Adopted Fire Code Amendments," and §92.21, "Outdoor and Open Burning."

This ordinance amendment has been reviewed by me for content and the City Attorney for substance. It appears under the regular order of business.

## AUTHORIZE THE USE OF RECEIVING BOARDS

**WHEREAS**, the City of Saginaw conducts City, State and Federal general and special elections as allowed by law; and

**WHEREAS**, each of the City's precincts at the close of the polls, prepare the necessary paperwork to be sealed in a transfer container, seal the ballots in the ballot box, and deliver the materials to the City Clerk's Office; and

**WHEREAS**, under Michigan law, MCL 168.679a, the legislative body of a City, by resolution, can authorize the Election Commissioners of the City to appoint receiving boards to accept and open the sealed containers for review and verification in accordance with MCL 168.679a.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Election Commissioners for the City of Saginaw, which consists of the Chief of Police, City Attorney and City Clerk, are hereby authorized to appoint the necessary receiving boards to receive the materials, such as transfer containers, memory packs, electronic poll book flash drives, AutoMark flash cards and ballot boxes, from the precincts at the close of the polls for all future elections; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that in accordance with MCL 168.679a, each board will consist of an equal number, or as near as possible, of inspectors from each major political party.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the receiving boards will be authorized to open the sealed containers to verify: 1) that the number of ballots issued equals the number of voters in the poll book and on the ballot summary; 2) confirm that the ballot box has been properly sealed for each precinct and that nothing other than ballots are contained within; and 3) verify that all necessary documents have been properly signed by the election inspectors of each precinct.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the receiving board, with the election inspectors, shall together take the necessary steps to correct any discrepancies, making notation of such correction in the poll book and shall notify the clerk of the corrective action taken. Upon review and correction, if necessary, the receiving board shall properly reseal the ballot boxes and seal the envelopes.
